PRE-DEPARTURE INFORMATION

PREPARATIONS FOR YOUR JOURNEY

PASSPORT & VISAS

- ▣ Ensure your passport is valid for at least 6 months beyond your date of arrival.
- ▣ List Visa Exception Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam, Timor Leste, Suriname, Colombia, Hong Kong, SAR, Brazil, Turkey.
- ▣ Electronic Visa-on-Arrival: Travelers from eligible countries can apply online for the Indonesia Electronic Visa on Arrival (eVOA). A simple and faster process implemented by the Government to enter the country. Travelers are permitted a single-entry stay of up to 30 days and extendable for the next 30 days. Please click <https://evisa.imigrasi.go.id/> to apply eVOA then you will receive the approved visa by email.
- ▣ Step to complete the Arrival Card for Foreign Visitors
 1. Visit allindonesia.imigrasi.go.id
 2. Select "English" and "Foreign Visitor" and fill in the required info:
 3. Personal details: nationality, name, DOB, passport number & expiry, and contact info
 4. Travel details: arrival/departure dates, enter your e-Visa or ITAS or KITAP number
 5. Transport & accommodation: arrival location, flight/ship details, hotel/address
 6. Health & customs declarations: symptoms, recent travel, items to declare (animals, electronics, baggage, etc.), IMEI registration for devices
 7. Submit the form to receive your QR code.
 8. Present the QR code (either printed or on your device) along with passport upon arrival.

BALI TOURISM LEVY FEE

All international visitors to Bali must pay a one-time fee of IDR 150,000 (approx. USD 10) per entry, including children at this link <https://lovebali.baliprov.go.id/>

TRAVEL INSURANCE

We recommend travel insurance that covers:

- ▣ Emergency medical care
- ▣ Lost luggage and travel delays
- ▣ Natural disasters and activity-related coverage.

PACKING ESSENTIALS

- ▣ Light, breathable clothing (linen, cotton)
- ▣ Sarong/shawl for temple visits
- ▣ Swimwear, sandals, walking shoes
- ▣ Reef-safe sunscreen, insect repellent, sunglasses, hat
- ▣ Power adapter (Type C/F, 220V)
- ▣ Dry bag for beach days or water activities

CURRENCY & BANKING INFORMATION

- ▣ Local currency: Indonesian Rupiah (IDR)
- ▣ IDR 100,000 ~ USD 6-7 (approximate)
- ▣ Exchange at licensed money changers or banks
- ▣ Credit card usage: Widely accepted in hotels, restaurants, and large shops Small vendors and local markets may require cash Always carry small denominations for tipping or purchases

INTRODUCTION TO BALINESE & INDONESIAN CUISINE

Balinese cuisine is an expression of the island's spiritual and agricultural traditions. Meals often center around rice, paired with an array of spicy sambals, grilled meats, vegetables, and fragrant coconut-based curries. The flavors are bold yet balanced, with influences from Java, Sumatra, India, and China.

Signature Dishes to Try:

- Babi Guling: Balinese-style roast pork, marinated with turmeric, coriander, and garlic
- Bebek Betutu: Slow-cooked duck wrapped in banana leaves and spices
- Nasi Campur Bali: A mixed rice plate with small portions of meat, tofu, vegetables, and sambal
- Lawar: A mix of minced meat, coconut, vegetables, and rich spices
- Sate Lilit: Minced fish or chicken on lemongrass sticks, grilled to perfection
- Jaja Bali: A selection of traditional Balinese desserts made from sticky rice and palm sugar

LOCAL FAVORITES

IBU OKA – UBUD

- A legendary local eatery famous for Babi Guling. Anthony Bourdain once declared it a must-try. Located just steps from Ubud Palace.

NASI AYAM KEDEWATAN BU MANGKU – UBUD

- Specializes in Nasi Ayam (chicken rice) with sambal, egg, peanuts, and long beans—true Balinese comfort food.





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

LOCAL CUSTOMS & ETIQUETTE

HOW SHOULD I DRESS IN BALI?

- Casual Wear: Lightweight clothing is perfect for Bali's tropical weather.
- Temples: Cover your shoulders and knees. Most temples provide sarongs if needed.
- Beaches: Swimwear is appropriate at the beach or poolside—but not in shops or towns.

WHAT ARE THE CULTURAL DO'S AND DON'TS?

Do:

- Use your right hand to give or receive items.
- Greet with a smile; Balinese people are gracious and polite.
- Offer a soft "Om Swastiastu" (Balinese greeting) if visiting temples.

Don't:

- Touch anyone's head (even a child's).
- Raise your voice or display frustration is highly valued.
- Step over or disturb offerings placed on the ground (canang sari).

CAN I VISIT TEMPLES FREELY?

- Yes, most temples welcome visitors. Dress respectfully and avoid entering during ceremonies unless invited.

WHAT SHOULD I KNOW ABOUT INTERACTING WITH PRIESTS OR MONKS?

- Avoid touching or photographing them without permission. Women should not touch or hand items directly to priests.

WHAT IF I LOSE SOMETHING IMPORTANT?

- Contact our Bali team immediately. We'll help check with your hotel, activity providers, and assist with reporting to the Tourist Police (dial 112 or visit Denpasar station).

WHAT SHOULD I DO IN CASE OF A MEDICAL EMERGENCY?

- Reach out to us first. We will guide you to the nearest reputable clinic or hospital and assist with transport, insurance, and translation if needed.

WHAT IF I SUSPECT A SCAM?

- Politely decline overly persistent street sellers.
- Inform us right away. We'll help verify services and intervene if necessary.
- Avoid accepting unsolicited transport or tour offers from strangers.
- Be cautious of currency exchange offers with high rates.

WHAT IF MY PHONE IS LOST OR STOLEN?

- We'll direct you to the nearest police station and help you file a report. We can also help contact your service provider to block or locate the device.

WHAT IF THERE'S A LANGUAGE BARRIER?

- Our team is on standby to assist. Most tourist-facing locals speak English, but for remote areas, use translation apps or request phrases from us in advance.

TRANSPORTATION

HOW DO I GET AROUND EFFICIENTLY?

- Use Grab or Gojek (ride-hailing apps). For local charm, try a Bemo or Gojek (motorbike taxi), but agree on a price first.

ARE MOTORBIKE RENTALS SAFE?

- Only if you have an international driving permit. Always wear a helmet and avoid riding in rain or traffic-heavy areas if inexperienced.

HOW CAN I ENSURE FAIR PRICING WITH TAXIS?

- Use metered taxis from Blue Bird or apps like Grab. Avoid unmetered taxis unless price is clearly agreed upon in advance.

SAFEST WAY TO REACH TOURIST SITES LIKE UBUD OR ULUWATU?

- Hire a private driver for the day. It's affordable and more comfortable for long distances or full-day excursions.

CAN I USE BOATS TO EXPLORE NEARBY ISLANDS?

- Yes, fast boats connect Bali to Nusa Penida, Lembongan, and the Gilis. Choose reputable operators like BlueWater Express and check the sea conditions during the rainy season (Nov–Mar).

PRACTICAL TIPS

HOW DO I GET LOCAL CURRENCY SAFELY?

- Use ATMs at major banks (BCA, Mandiri, BNI) and avoid small stand-alone ATMs. Currency exchange is best done at authorized money changers (e.g., Central Kuta, BMC).

HOW DO I KEEP MY VALUABLES SAFE?

- Use hotel safes. Carry a small dry bag for phones/wallets during excursions. Be discreet when using phones or money in public.

DO I NEED TO TIP IN BALI?

- Tipping is appreciated but not mandatory. Round up bills in restaurants or leave 5–10%. For hotel porters or drivers, 10,000–20,000 IDR is customary.

HOW DO I PREPARE FOR DAY TOURS OR ISLAND HOPPING?

- Pack sunscreen, water shoes, a hat, and a light cover-up. Consider bringing your own snorkel gear if you're concerned about hygiene.

INSIDER TIPS FOR A SMOOTH STAY

- **SIM CARDS:** Buy local SIMs (Telkomsel, XL, Indosat) at the airport or mini-marts. 10GB data packages start around IDR 100,000 (~USD 7).
- **BEST TIME TO EXPLORE:** March is shoulder season: warm, tropical, occasional light rain. Early mornings or late afternoons are ideal for temple and beach visits.
- **CULTURAL ETIQUETTE:** Always smile and greet with respect. Do not touch anyone's head. Dress modestly at temples (cover knees and shoulders). Remove shoes when entering homes or sacred spaces.

- ▣ Follow locals to their favorite warungs. Spots like Nasi Ayam Kedewatan Bu Mangku and Warung Nasi Bali offer rich flavors at affordable prices.

IS BALI STREET FOOD SAFE?

- ▣ Yes, especially at busy markets where food turnover is high. Choose hot, freshly prepared items and avoid pre-cut fruits without peel.

- ▣ Babi Guling – Spit-roasted pork
- ▣ Bebek Betutu – Spiced duck wrapped in banana leaves
- ▣ Sate Lilit – Minced fish skewers
- ▣ Jaja Bali – Traditional Balinese sweets

ARE VEGETARIAN OR HALAL OPTIONS AVAILABLE?

- ▣ Yes. Bali has excellent vegetarian restaurants (Zest, Alchemy) and many halal warungs, especially in areas like Denpasar and Nusa Dua.

HOW DO I ORDER FOOD LIKE A LOCAL?

- ▣ Try basic phrases like “Tidak pedas” (not spicy) or “Sedikit pedas” (a little spicy). Most eateries accommodate requests with a smile.
